# 2010 Autumn Skate

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Skate Canada - Eastern Ontario extends this invitation to all eligible persons in figure skating in Canada and the United States. U.S.F.S.A. members must hold U.S.F.S.A. test qualifications equivalent to the Skate Canada test qualifications specified in this Announcement. Skate Canada rules and regulations will apply throughout the competition except where otherwise provided in this Announcement. The Host Committee is prepared to attempt to accommodate U.S.F.S.A. members by modifying the content for specific events as set out below where the required content for such events differs from the required content for equivalent U.S.F.S.A. events. Specific requests should be made to the competition registrar.

Rule amendments passed at this year's Skate Canada A.C.G.M. as well as changes which may be made in I.S.U. regulations and which are applicable to Skate Canada sanctioned competitions shall also apply. See Rule 1602 (8) (a) & (b). Rule numbers throughout are from the 2002 Rulebook using 2001, through to 2010 amendments.



Due to a number of requests to pay for competitions with a credit card, we are pleased to introduce a new payment option "PayPal". Payments may also be made by cheque, money order or cash. We

have also begun to introduce interactive entry/test form(s) which can be completed online and printed (as parent/guardian signature and Test Chair or designate signature is required) then mailed or couriered to the Section Office - see below.

### NOTE - DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES - IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Registration may be limited if entries exceed the amount of ice time available.
- Regardless of which type of payment option is used - Entry Forms will be accepted on a first serve basis, therefore skaters should register as soon as possible
- Entry Forms & Fees, including any required supporting documentation, must be completed in FULL or they will not be processed and will be returned
- **All Entry Forms must be received no later than 4.00pm on Friday, August 13th, 2010 regardless of postmark, courier date, or, if using PayPal, scanned (email) or Fax - it is important to note that once the deadline date & time has been reached PayPal will be closed down for this event on the EOS Website.**
- A separate Entry Form must be completed for each event
- **Payment through PayPal without completing the applicable Entry/Test Form is NOT considered a registration.**
- Entry/Test Forms, along with a cheque or money order and proof of age (if applicable) may be mailed or couriered as has been the standard. *Entry/Test forms & proof of age (if applicable) may be scanned or faxed only if PayPal is used as the payment option.*
- Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the EOS Championship Chair and Officials Chair

**TEST FORMS:** Competitive Testing will be available at this event. Tests will be judged using the CPC Scoring System. **\*\*Skaters wishing to be tested in "Combined" Events MUST compete in both parts of the event to be tested.** PayPal will also be offered for this service; however, the separate Testing Entry Forms for on-site competitive testing **must** be used. If the option to forward the Test Forms to the Registrar via Canada Post is used, then all supporting documentation must be completed in FULL or they will not be accepted or processed. Separate cheques must be sent, one for the competition and one for the test. **Closing Date: 13 Aug 10 & Withdrawal date: 2 Sep 10**

**CONFIRMATIONS AND SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:** The Event Schedule, Skater Confirmations and Starting Order (first event only) will be posted on the Section Website <http://www.skate-eos.on.ca/competitions.html> - they will not be mailed out via Canada Post. Events may proceed up to one-half hour prior to the published schedule

**EVENT SCHEDULE:** STARSkate events will take place on Thursday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2010 only. As space will be limited, entries for STARSkate will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Therefore, it is important to get your entry form in as quickly as possible. Competitive Events may commence on Thursday and run through to Sunday - entries for competitive events will also be accepted on a first come first serve basis.

Registration in certain events may need to be limited in order to accommodate the ice time available. This decision is at the discretion of the EOS Championship Chair & Officials Chair. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause. **Skaters whose registration is not accepted for whatever reason will be notified by email only.**

**AGE REQUIREMENTS:** Age qualifications shall apply as of **July 1, 2010**. Where relevant, a photocopy of the skater's birth certificate or other acceptable proof of age **MUST ACCOMPANY** the Entry Form. **NOTE: If using PayPal a copy of the skater's birth certificate may be faxed along with the entry form, or scanned and emailed**

**TEST REQUIREMENTS:** Test qualifications shall apply as of **July 1, 2010**. **All skaters are permitted to "skate up" one level**, that is to say, enter an event one level above the level for which they are actually qualified to enter and they may compete at either or both of these levels. **Respecting the Pre-Preliminary STARSkate Freeskate events, a skater may enter only one of the A, B or C categories.**

**CANCELLATION OF EVENTS - NUMBER OF ENTRIES:** An event will be cancelled if there is only one entry. The EOS Championship Chair and Officials Chair reserve the right to limit the number of entries in any event as well as to combine or subdivide events as numbers may warrant.

#### REFUNDS AND WITHDRAWALS:

- Entries withdrawn **by August 13, 2010** will be given full refunds.
- A full refund will also be given if an event is cancelled.
- **After August 13, 2010** refunds will be granted only for withdrawals for medical reasons and then only if the Host Committee is notified of such medical withdrawals **prior to the start of the event** and if a **medical certificate** is received by the Competition Registrar **by October 1, 2010**.
- A **\$25.00 administration fee per event** with a maximum of \$50.00 per skater, dance, or pair team will be charged for all such withdrawals **after August 13, 2010**.



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**RETURNED CHEQUES:** A \$25.00 **administration fee** will be charged for each NSF or other returned cheque. The amount of the returned cheque and the \$25.00 administration fee must be paid in cash or by certified cheque, bank draft, money order or similar form of guaranteed payment **prior to the skater being permitted to compete**. Skaters will not be permitted to register for the competition if they have not paid all outstanding registration fees in full. If outstanding fees are being paid at registration, only certified cheques or cash will be accepted.

**PRACTICE ICE:** Practice ice will not be provided.

**ICE SURFACES:** Both the Walkley and Peplinski ice surfaces are 85 feet by 200 feet

**REGISTRATION:** All competitors are required to register at **least one hour** before the **start** of an event **regardless of the 'order of skate'**.

**PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT SHEET:** The Planned Program Content Sheet must be handed in at the time of registration. If you register **after** your event has started your PPC Sheet **MAY NOT** be delivered to the Officials Panel Rink side. Planned Program Sheets can be filled in 'on-line' on the Section Website at <http://www.skate-eos.on.ca/competitions.html> - once completed they can be printed and brought to the Registration Desk on the day of the event.

**WELL BALANCED PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:** Where applicable all Programs shall meet the requirements of the Well Balanced Program Criteria. This may be found on the Skate Canada ([www.skatecanada.ca](http://www.skatecanada.ca)) and the Skate Canada - Eastern Ontario ([www.skate-eos.on.ca](http://www.skate-eos.on.ca)) websites.

**COACHES - CHOREOGRAPHERS ACCREDITATION:** All coaches/choreographers must meet the standards for coaches/choreographers set out in Rule 2402 and Rule 2408 in order to be accredited at 2010 Autumn Skate. *All coaches shall be paid Skate Canada coaching members, hold a valid first aid certificate, and hold Primary STARSkate Coach NCCP Level 1 certification or higher*

**ALL COACHES MUST HAVE PHOTO ID TO BE ACCREDITED AT THIS COMPETITION** - Coaches who cannot provide proof of current Skate Canada membership will be subject to a \$20.00 fee for a temporary pass. For coaches who have not completed their Photo ID, the form may be found on the Skate Canada - Eastern Ontario website ... "Coaching" - <http://www.skate-eos.on.ca/coaching.html>. New photo ID will be available for pick up September 16<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at the Jim Durrell Arena. Please allow two weeks minimum for processing of Photo IDs.

## MUSIC REQUIREMENTS:

- Each entry must provide 2 cassettes or CD's for the Competition upon registration. If 2 CD's are provided, it is recommended that a back-up cassette be available.
- *Technical Advisement (from the EOS Music & Announcing Committee)* For optimum playback of the music recorded on CDs it is recommended that the music be recorded (written) to the CD in either Compact Disc Audio (CDA) or Wave file (wav) format. Music recorded in MP3 or i-Tune format may not play from the EOS music playback equipment.
- Music **must be registered** at Music Registration **at least one hour before the event**.
- Each cassette or CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container. Damaged or missing CD case or Cassette case - a replacement fee of up to \$1.00 will be charged.
- Each cassette or CD and its **container** must be **clearly marked** with the following:
  1. One for competition (marked "Master") and one for back up (marked "copy")
  2. Skater's name
  3. Club
  4. Event
  5. Actual music playing time, **not the skating time**, nor the event time.
  6. Only one program shall be recorded on each cassette or CD.







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**RESULTS:** Results will be determined using the Cumulative Point Calculation (CPC) for all Competitive events. The One by One system (OBO) will be used for all STARSkate events. Result Sheets will **not** be available for sale.

**AWARDS:** Medals will be awarded in accordance with Rule 7000B (1.13). *Skaters must be in skating attire and skates for all presentations.*

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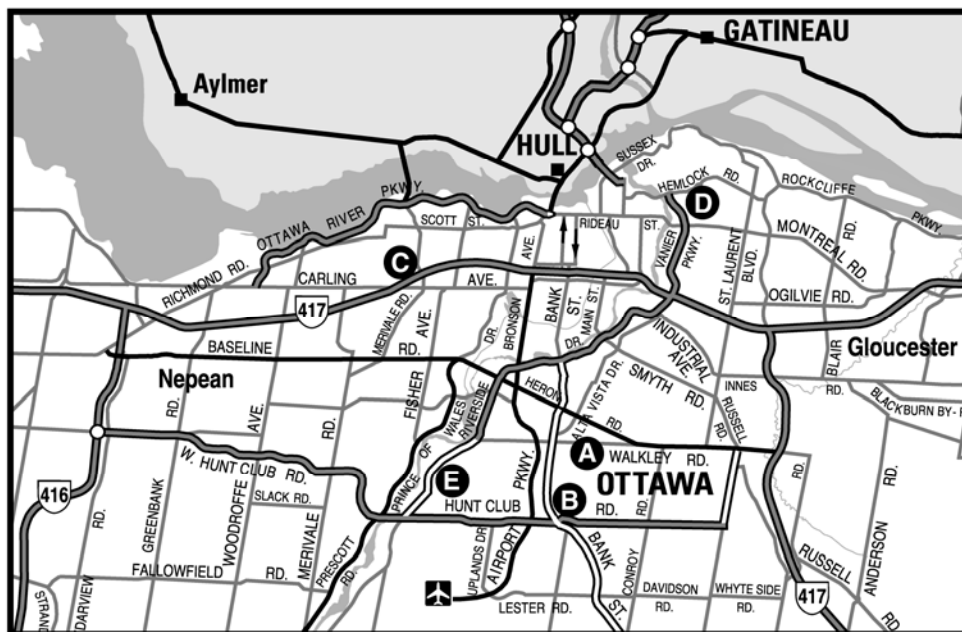
